"I found that this training, through the questions asked and the information provided, really helped me to see my own and structural biases. I now feel more confident about making positive changes within the organisations I am involved in, as well as personally being more equipped to address an issue of racism when I see it happen.

The training also showed clearly how an organisation has to ask about who is not engaging and why, rather than assuming that if we are very busy meeting the needs of those who come to us then we must be doing a good job.

I found also that the relaxed non-judgemental setting and small group really helped us to be honest and open, which was imperative for learning.

"It made it more comfortable to ask uncomfortable questions in order to really understand and move forward. For me, if I am to be truly honest, and I expect other people may feel the same, an anxiety about "making a mistake" or using a wrong term (even if meant well) is something that could really get in the way of learning. There is a need to unlearn this and also acknowledge it in order to make progress

I found that people in the group sharing their lived experiences was important and added a lot to our discussion, although as was pointed out in the group, it can be unfair for the people experiencing racism to also have the burden of raising awareness and addressing it.

"Ebun provided an empowerment piece and understanding that, as frontline workers, we can address racism in the workplace/ work environment in a way that provides space for healthy conversations/debates without bringing personal triggers or traumas to the conversation. I can be more objective in that I don't need to know all the correct answers there on the spot.

If required, I can ask to return to the conversation and a different stage and get support from colleagues so a healthy discussion can occur and my triggers do not direct it. I want to challenge my discomfort and fear around having healthy conversations in white spaces and remind myself as I learnt that racism was not created by me or the other person in the room today. It was something that was created over 500 years ago and something that is inherited. I can learn to address it as a matter of fact rather than from personal emotions.
